## Senior Year: College Planning

*There are a number of things that a busy senior must do! The following list is designed to help a senior keep track of some of these important things.*

### All year long

- Research and apply for scholarships.
- Keep up your grades! Colleges look at your senior grades. This is no time to slack off after so much hard work.

### September

- Review graduation status and college plans with your counselor.
- Begin to prepare your senior resume.
- Sign up to take or retake the ACT or SAT—the ACT is required for colleges in Idaho while the SAT is required by some out-of-state schools.
- Listen to daily announcements and watch for flyers posted outside the Counseling Office.
- Go online to colleges checking scholarships, dates, admission application forms and financial aid information.

### October

- Attend the Southeast Idaho College Fair.
- Take the ACT or SAT.
- Listen to daily announcements and watch for flyers posted outside the Counseling Office.
- Get your copy of the Scholarship Handbook from the Counseling Office.
- Continue to research scholarships and write for applications.
- Attend other college open houses.

## **November**

- Get college admission applications. Applications available for all Idaho colleges in the Counseling Office.
- Ask for letters of recommendation from teachers or counselor who know you well.
- Provide resume information to those who are writing recommendations for you.
- Listen to daily announcements and watch for flyers posted outside the Counseling Office.
- Reapply for the ACT if you want to take it one more time.
- If you need to write an essay for admission, start now. BYU and some other colleges require an essay.
- Apply for on-campus housing if desired (fills up early at some schools).

## **December**

- Final administrations of the ACT or SAT tests with results available in time for most school's scholarship deadlines.
- Apply for admission to the college(s) and technical school(s) of your choice. (Most institutions require admission applications before, or at the same time as, scholarship applications.)
- Listen to daily announcements and watch for flyers posted outside the Counseling Office.
- Christmas break is a great time to complete college and scholarship applications.
- Request an official transcript from the school secretary to complete the application process.
- Mail applications, transcripts and recommendations. (Even if school's deadline is later, applications received early are read more carefully.)

## **January**

- Apply for financial aid. Try the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online (or get the proper financial aid forms from the Counseling Office).
- Find out if your college has separate forms for financial aid. If so, fill these out.
- Yes, you guessed it, listen to daily announcements and watch for flyers posted outside the Counseling Office and check due dates.
- Call admissions offices of schools to verify your application has been received.
- Verify that all parts of your scholarship application has been received, including letters of recommendation, transcripts and grades.

## **February**

- Follow-up on any remaining steps required for admission or scholarship application processing.
- Listen to announcements for any new scholarships and check due dates.

## **March**

- Don't forget to listen to the announcements for new scholarships and due dates.

## **April**

- Receive notification of admission decisions from colleges.
- Carefully select the college you will attend next fall.
- Once you have made a final decision, write other colleges and decline their acceptance.
- Evaluate scholarship and financial aid offers and accept or decline them in writing.
- Let your counselor in on your decisions concerning college and scholarship choices.
- Listen to daily announcements and watch for flyers posted outside the Counseling Office.

## **May**

- Notify the counseling office of scholarships you have received.
- Listen to the announcements for information you need for graduation.
- Graduate!

## **Summer/fall**

- Attend freshman orientation if your school has one.

## **Fall**

- Go for it! Study hard and good luck!

### **Note: College Planning**

*One of the biggest mistakes that students make in planning for college is not starting soon enough. Don't wait until your senior year to take tough classes. Don't wait until your senior year to become concerned about your grade point average. Don't wait until your senior year to get to know your high school counselor. Don't wait until your senior year to take the ACT or the SAT test. Don't wait until your senior year to decide to go to college.*

## **Planning for your future:**

### **SEOP**

The **S**tudent **E**ducation/**O**ccupation **P**lan (SEOP) is an actual education/vocation process. The SEOP, or educational plan, is developed by the student, parents and the counselor. Graduation requirements are reviewed, career goals are discussed and then decisions are made as to what classes will be needed to attain these goals. In other words, the SEOP incorporates information about you, and your career/occupation goals in an attempt to prepare you for success in the future. Also discussed are school involvement and community service during your high school years.

#### **DEVELOPING APPROPRIATE EDUCATIONAL PLANS**

Not all students know "exactly" what they want to do when they grow-up. Some find it extremely difficult to decide upon a career. Actually, research shows that individuals may change their careers a number of times during their lifetime. So, it's important to understand how to go about discovering jobs or careers that will meet your needs.

Planning for your future can be a learning process. To begin you need to learn about yourself. You need to discover your interests, your skills, your abilities, your strengths and weaknesses, and your work-related values.

You need to learn about the world of work. You need to explore jobs and careers to become aware of the many career opportunities. There are a number of resources you can use to learn about specific jobs. As you explore career possibilities it is important to pay close attention to job descriptions, job tasks, education and training requirements, job outlooks, job demands and even starting salary.

Next, match your interests, skills and abilities with different careers. Hopefully, during your career exploration process you have been able to find jobs and career possibilities that fit your interests, skills and abilities.

The last step in the SEOP process is to select **classes** that prepare you for your future. Keep in mind, some classes are required and need to be completed to meet graduation requirements. Other classes are electives and can be selected based on personal educational/occupational goals and preferences. If you plan on going to college, choose classes that will help you get prepared for your college or university work. If you plan on going to work right after high school, choose courses that will help you develop a skill or vocation. It is important to realize that most jobs or careers require at least some level of training or education.

## **Don't get scammed. . .on the way to college**

Unfortunately, in their efforts to pay the bills, many students and their families are falling prey to scholarship scams. The Federal Trade Commission cautions students to look for the six signs that a scholarship search may be a scholarship scam:

- **"This scholarship is guaranteed or your money back."** No one can guarantee that they'll get you a grant or scholarship. Refund guarantees often have conditions or strings attached. Get refund policies in writing—before you pay.
- **"You can't get this information anywhere else."** There are many free lists of scholarships available. Check with your school or library before you decide to pay someone to do the work for you.
- **"May I have your credit card or bank account number to hold this scholarship?"** Don't give out your credit card or bank account number on the phone without getting information in writing first. It may be a set-up for an unauthorized withdrawal from your account.
- **"We'll do all the work."** Don't be fooled. There's no way around it. You must apply for scholarships or grants yourself.
- **"The scholarship will cost some money."** Don't pay anyone who claims to be "holding" a scholarship or grant for you. Free money shouldn't cost a thing.
- **"You've been selected" by a 'national foundation' to receive a scholarship, or "You're a finalist" in a contest that you never entered.** Before you send money to apply for a scholarship, check it out. Make sure the foundation or program is legitimate.

The Federal Trade Commission suggests that students check with their school counselor or local librarian for free information about current scholarships before paying someone for the same or similar scholarship lists. For more information about planning and paying for college, the FTC suggests visiting the web site for Sallie Mae, a financial services corporation that specializes in funding student loans. The U.S. Department of Education also has a student guide on the web. This student guide claims to be the most comprehensive resource on student financial aid. Grants, loans and work-study are the three major forms of student financial aid available through the Federal Student Financial Assistance Programs. Updated each award year. The Student Guide tells you about the programs and how to apply for them.

**Listed below are some helpful hints to use while applying for scholarships:**

1. **Be on time! Even better be early!** Never is it more important to adhere to deadlines than when applying for scholarships.
2. **Dig hard!** Pursue every avenue in your search. Your parents and your counselor simply do not have the time to look for you.
3. **Don't give up!** It is a lot of work looking for scholarships; however, your efforts will eventually pay off if you search far and wide and are a scholarship-worthy student. Keep on trying!
4. **Read the fine print!** Follow application directions to the letter.
5. **Whenever possible, type your application!** It will look much neater and more professional.
6. **Give your references at least two weeks to write a letter of recommendation for you.** It is simply common courtesy, and they will write a better letter if given plenty of time.
7. **Photocopy your completed application!** Who knows? You may be able to use a single essay for several applications. Also, things can get lost in the mail.
8. **Take the ACT/SAT as early as possible—before December of your senior year!** Many scholarships require results of either test or possibly both.
9. **Apply for financial aid in January** by completing the FAFSA. These forms are available in the Counseling Office and online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).

Scholarships are provided by the university, alumni and private donors and are awarded on the basis of academic excellence and promise of future achievement. Financial need is an additional factor for some scholarship awards.
